The work of sponsorship children started in the year of 2007. The name Precious Hands was officially given in 2012 as we began to extend the work into the villages of Baithkwa, Hardon and Shankargarh. Hundreds of children have been given access to primary education and through these children the families and community have been educated through awareness programs on health and hygiene, adult literacy and raising awareness among young teenage girls of MHM (menstrual hygiene management). Child labour is no longer prevalent in these areas. Girls are now



attending school and child marriage is no longer practiced. These are some of the changes that have taken place because of the dedicated teachers and staff who have faithfully laboured over the years. It has been made possible through the partners of Precious Hands who birthed, invested and shared the vision of Precious Hands despite the challenges, struggles and disappointments which were faced and overcome.

Please do uphold us in prayer. We are moving forward on the completion of the Hardon School building with staff quarters. We continue to equip children

with primary education, books and school supplies, uniforms and hygiene supplies along with other activities for their overall development.
